Progress Report #1September 2014 – January 2015 Climate Change Facilitation Project (CCFP)

As we move forward from the New York Climate Summit, from COP 20 in Lima and toward Paris in December 2015, dialogue, social innovation, and mobilization of diverse stakeholders toward a sustainable future remains critically important across sectors and at various scales.

Over its first 4 months, the Climate Change Facilitation Project (CCFP) has achieved concrete progress in the following areas:

- -Through an online platform and presentations of case studies at Climate Week NYC, made connections to approximately 80 contacts, organizations, and potential partners worldwide about facilitation tools applied to mitigating climate change
- -Documented and published a process model for achieving collaborative, sector-wide climate action
- -Developed and delivered a prototype of a short course for 35 participants at the Coady International Institute, a modified version of which is now available for building capacity and mobilizing collaborative climate action: Course in Results Based Planning and Management in a Multi-Stakeholder Context -Facilitated a Rapid Assessment / Situation Analysis with 60 staff, board members and members of Atlantic Canada's leading Environment non-profit, the Ecology Action Centre, and from dozens of issues,
- Atlantic Canada's leading Environment non-profit, the Ecology Action Centre, and from dozens of issued determined 4 consensus investment priorities for "Strengthening Leadership and Action on Climate Change in Nova Scotia"
- -Further developed a suite of services and tools now available to climate leaders and organizations.

- 3. Support to Teams, Organizations and Climate Change related Projects

Much remains to be done. Next for CCFP is to reach out to supporters, potential partners and climate leaders to assist them in their work in scaling up climate action.
